Children

In preparation for the new school year, Hope Haven trained over 60 new Beaufort County



School District teachers and staff in Darkness to Light's Stewards of Children program. Hope Haven also trained more than 30 St. Helena Elementary teachers and staff. The Stewards of Children program educates and empowers adults to prevent, recognize and respond appropriately to child sexual abuse. The program is so effective that with every adult trained, 10



children on average are protected. Thanks to Hope Haven, 900 school children will now be protected by their new teachers.

She was also a member of the Coordinated Community Response to Domestic Violence Task Force that improved the community response to children exposed to domestic violence. As Hope Haven's Director of Prevention/Outreach Services, Leigh-Ann oversees the implementation of abuse prevention programs in the community, including the Darkness to Light Stewards of Children program, Mentors in Violence Prevention (MVP), and the Men Can Stop Rape Men of Strength (MOST) Club. Mrs. Shoupe also serves as a member of the Sara Schuh Child Abuse Conference Planning Committee.

From January to June 2012, Hope Haven served:

231 direct victims of child abuse and sexual assault.

75%: children under the age of 16

44%: children under the age of 11

78%: child sexual abuse and sexual assault cases

35%: child physical abuse and/or neglect cases

340 indirect victims (family members, loved ones, spouses and siblings who are just as impacted by the crime)
